
The real Jesus

Things are not always as they seem. Underneath a church that I worked in, are a series of underground passages that go on for about a mile! People are the same - when you are talking to someone and they tell you they are very ill, or recovered from addiction, you see more to them. Or you may find out that someone you thought little of visits an elderly person every week. People are not always as they seem. The mountain visit was the same: the apostles saw Jesus - son of God, radiant in prayer, and in the middle of it all the Passion was announced. They saw the person behind the face.

The big truth of Jesus is that he is intimately united to God the Father. So following him is not just action, but prayer that leads to action. We say someone is a great Christian - he or she helps the poor. Christianity is more - it is also prayer and the Eucharist. While we are thankful for the good lives of many people, we also can say that the full Christian life includes prayer and Mass.

It also involves community - the three were called to witness and help each other remember the Lord Jesus. Community brings the word of God alive in a real way. The community of the Church brings us to fuller faith.

**P**rayer leads to action for others, and action leads back to prayer. We can be so close to heavenly things that we are no earthly good! Lent brings us into this mystery of the death and resurrection of the Lord - we are part of this, and we try to make life a grace for others. We can transfigure the lives of others, or disfigure. Let's be people of the transfiguration.

That those who make riches from violence and war Might hear in their dreams the cries of the lost.


That we might see through our fear of each other A new vision to heal our fatal attraction to aggression.

#### Launch of Guided Walk for Wicklow Town Heritage Trail

Plans have now been put in place to hold the inaugural guided walk of the Wicklow Town Heritage Trail. The walk will commence at 11am on Saturday 19th March from the first stop on the Heritage Trail, which is at St. Patrick's Church, Wicklow Town.

The walk will be led by local historian, John Finlay, whose detailed knowledge of local history was central in creating the Wicklow Town Heritage Trail.

To complete the Heritage Trail, it will take around 2 hours, allowing participants to spend some time at each location.

The Heritage Trail features 24 points of interest – detailing the history of Wicklow Town, from the landing of St. Patrick in 432, to the end of the Civil War in 1923.

There are 7 story-boards (lecterns) with beautifully illustrated artwork showing the following:

The construction of St. Patrick's church, which commenced in 1839.

The story of the Franciscan Abbey, which dates back to the 12<sup>th</sup> Century.

Robert Halpin's achievement in laying the first Trans-Atlantic cable.

The story of Billy Byrne and the 1798 rising in Wicklow Town.

The history of the Black Castle.

The attempted landing by St. Patrick at the Travelahawk Beach.

The history relating to the Barrow Green, including stories of the secret burials that took place there.

After the inaugural guided walk, plans are now being put in place to have a weekly guided walk of the Wicklow Town Heritage Trail with effect from Saturday 16<sup>th</sup> April 2022.

#### Church Repairs

Work on repairing the damage due to dry rot and dampness in St Patrick's Church has been ongoing for the past couple of months. A large part of the work in the gallery/ belfry/ shop area has now been completed but there is still some work to do replacing lead flashing around the roof to ensure that the building is damp-proof for the years ahead. Thanks to a heritage grant from Wicklow County Council, as well as some parish reserves, we have been able to manage to pay for the work so far. However, in order to complete the work, we are asking parishioners if they can afford it, to make a donation to the building fund in the envelopes provided at the church doors. I know that the people of Wicklow are very proud of out beautiful church and that you will agree that it is our duty to preserve this important part of our heritage for future generations.
