

#### 17th: St Anthony

Died 356, 'Father of Monasticism' lived a life of solitude but also attracted many others to form communities of hermits.

#### 21st: St Agnes

Wealthy and beautiful, was martyred for here virginity in the last persecutions in Rome, in the early fourth century. Patron of betrothed couples, gardeners and young girls.

#### 22nd: St Vincent

Deacon of the church of Saragossa, Spain, martyred in 304 in Valencia after prolonged torture.

## Week of Prayer for Christian Unity 2022



### Theme

The theme for the 2022 Week of Prayer is 'We saw the star in the East, and we came to worship him' (Mt 2:2), taken from the account of the visit of the magi to pay homage to the infant king (Mt 2:1-12). It is a call to unity, of those from the North and the South, from the East and from the West, old and young, men and women.

### Introduction

The story of the Magi visiting the Holy Family in Bethlehem is one very familiar to us. The Magi have sometimes been seen as a symbol of the world's diversity – different religions and cultures – that comes to pay homage to the Christ-child. The story might therefore represent the unity of all created that God desires.

The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity in 2022 has been prepared by the churches of the Middle East, the history of which was, and still is, characterised by conflict and strife, tainted with blood and darkened by injustice and oppression. The Christians of the Middle East offer these resources conscious that the world shares many of the travails and much of the difficulties that it experiences, and yearns for a light to lead the way to the Saviour who is the light that overcomes darkness.

Serving the Gospel today requires a commitment to the human being, especially the poorest, the weakest and those marginalised. It requires from the churches transparency and accountability in dealing with the world, and with each other. This means churches need to cooperate to provide relief to the afflicted, to welcome the displaced, to relieve the burdened, and to build a just and honest society. This is a call for churches to work together so that young people can build a good future according to God's heart, a future in which all human beings can experience life, peace, justice, and love.

#### PARISH VISITATIONS ~ FIRST FRIDAY CALLS

On the First Friday of every month our priests visit Parishioners who are sick or housebound. During these visits, they have a chat, hear confessions and bring Holy Communion. There are also Masses in Blainroe Lodge, the Day Care Centre & Knockrobin Care Home.

Following on from that, our Eucharistic Ministers also visit the homes of those who are housebound every Sunday with the Blessed Sacrament. They always visit in pairs and provide a simple little prayer service, followed by Communion. They would normally leave the Newsletter and Sunday Mass leaflet with the Parishioner to allow them keep up to date with the parish.

This is a wonderful service provided by the Ministers and is greatly appreciated by those whom they visit.

As well as visiting the homes of individuals, some of the Ministers of the Eucharist provide a Prayer/ Communion service in the Day Care Centre on a monthly basis and in Blainroe Lodge & Knockrobin Care Home every Sunday. (Not during Covid times & always following the guidelines)

f you know of someone who would appreciate any of these services, please get in touch with the Parish Office in order to include them on the current list. This service is also available on a short term basis, for those who may be just out of hospital or those who are unable to get to the church for whatever reason. This Ministry is a separate one from the weekly or weekend Ministers of the Eucharist - If you feel that this might be of interest to you and you would like to volunteer to be either a driver or a Minister of the Eucharist for the Sick and Housebound, again, please get in touch with the Parish Office. There is full training available before anyone commits to this Ministry. Your help would be appreciated and you would be very welcome to join this team!
