#### **Forgiveness**

We are called to forgive; and that can be really difficult. You have been defrauded by the banks of your life's savings - can you forgive? You were abused as a child - can you forgive? You were done out of a job because another lied to get it - can you forgive? The answer is maybe 'no'. What then does God want? He asks us to open our hearts to the other so that we may forgive. Forgive-ness is the deepest of God's desires on our behalf, and he hopes that we can forgive each other.

Our hurts and burdens are heavy to carry through life. To for-give can release some of that weight. The person who hurt us may be dead, or may not even know (or care) that we are hurt-ing. When we desire to forgive but don't know how, one way of looking for this strength is to pray for it. We often pray, 'Lord, make my heart like yours'. When we pray that we are praying to be forgiving people!

Another way is to pray for the person. When we realise that as God loves me, he also loves everyone, we may find a spark or light of forgiveness in our souls. Out of this we may find the will to meet the other and talk to him or her, and find the grace of forgiveness between us.

Forgiveness sometimes comes slowly. When God sees us want-ing to be on the road to forgiveness, he gives us the graces we need to unburden ourselves and be able to love like him.

Sit in silence for a while, and send a blessing or prayer to someone you need to forgive.

Lord, I ask - make my heart like yours.

#### **HONESTY POLICY, CARDS & CANDLES**

We are introducing an Honesty Policy system to buy Mass Cards and candles in the Church after the weekend Masses. Initially there will be someone to help out with this.

The idea is that there will be envelopes left on a table on the Sacred Heart side of the Altar, black print for deceased and blue print for everything else, eg Get Well, Happy Birthday etc. You write the intentions name on the space on the front of the envelope enclose the €5 for the Mass card, and pop it into the letterbox on the door at the confession box.

The candles are now a new style and are €2 each - again the money can be put through the letterbox. Unfortunately there is no change facility, so please use the accurate amount of money.

This will be done for a trial period to see how it goes.

Full Mass Cards are still available in the Parish Office along with other stock, feel free to come in and have a look around.

#### PARISH PILGRIMAGE TO LOURDES 2023

I wasn't sure what to expect...and thanks to Storm Betty we had an exciting start to the trip as we had no electricity and found fallen trees on route to the 3am bus pick up. Getting through the airport however was more straightforward, due to great organization including the high vis vests we were provided. After a short flight and a very picturesque bus ride we arrived at Hotel La Solitude in perfect time for lunch.

<u>Day 1:</u> After lunch I went to explore the town and get my bearings. The town was very busy but easy to find my way around. There were no maps needed as following the crowds led me to the Sanctuary of Our Lady of Lourdes. Later I joined an introductory walking tour of the Sanctuary with Barra (our JWT rep) and then attended mass celebrated by Fr. Aquinas in the Poor Clare Church, a short walk from the hotel. After dinner most of the group went to the walk in the Torch Light Procession. The procession was so much bigger than I'd expected. Our group led the way with the beautiful banner. I never expected when we started walking that we would end up sitting on the steps to the right of the Basilica watching the lights of the torch light procession weave along while the huge crowd sang and raised their candles to 'Ave Maria'. It was a bit surreal and lovely to experience.

<u>Day 2:</u> The next morning we attended mass at the Grotto followed by the low stations of the cross led by Fr. Aquinas. After a group photo we visited the baths, a very peaceful and emotional experience where we were invited to wash our hands and face with and then drink Lourdes water. There was an option to go to a town called Gavarnie on a bus trip in the afternoon which I didn't opt for but instead spent some time with others on the trip and went for a coffee in one of the little cafes nearby. That evening I walked in the procession again, another lovely experience.

<u>Day 3:</u> In the morning I opted to join some others from the group to go to the Pic du Jer as I could see the illuminated cross up on the hill from my room in the hotel. We took a 100-year-old funicular train up to the top for some spectacular views of Lourdes. In the afternoon I went on the trip to Bartres, the place where St Bernadette lived as a child. We attended mass celebrated by Fr Aquinas and saw some of St Bernadette's handwriting from when she was learning to write. I didn't walk in the procession that evening, but instead watched some of the procession and went to light candles with some of the donation money from family and friends at home.

<u>Day 4:</u> I got up early to visit the Grotto and leave petitions from those at home in the intentions box. After breakfast we attended mass in the Poor Clare's church and then everyone went to see the parish candle being lit. We attended the Eucharistic procession in the underground Basilica in the afternoon. That night at the procession we got to carry the beautiful banner which is when I realized just how many people stop to take photos of it. It was very popular with everyone that passed by.

<u>Day 5:</u> I joined a few others from the group on the Little Tourist Train which brought on a 45-minute tour around Lourdes. It was the perfect way to see the areas of the town that we hadn't explored yet and I would definitely do some shopping in the markets the next time! Later we visited Cité Saint Pierre, where we attended mass and heard all about the work that is done by the volunteers who give their time to look after Pilgrims who come to stay there from all over the world. That evening we went to watch the procession rather than walk in it so that we could see it from a different perspective take in the whole beautiful sight.

The group was very welcoming, everyone was friendly and helpful giving tips if they had been there before. I liked that it was very clear what was on each day but there was no pressure to do everything. It was up to everyone to decide how they wanted to spend their time there. The hotel was beautiful, with comfortable rooms and plenty of food available in the buffet for every meal. For anyone who hasn't been to Lourdes I would really recommend it.


