Gospel Reflections Sharing and celebrating faith Donal Neary SJ

One of Mary's first recorded journeys was after the announcement to her that she was to be the mother of God. It was a journey of service, a visit to her cousin who needed help. When dealing with such challenges as pregnancy, bereavement, redundancy, a son in prison or a daughter on drugs - we want to talk and we want support.

Mary and Elizabeth had something else to share - their faith. The prayers they said have been said ever since. The stage was small but the audience has been millions ever since. They were not shy about their faith in their God.

In a time like ours we need to externalise our faith - to go to Church, send a card with a Christmas greeting, not just a season's wish - not to parade, but to make present our faith.

The meaning this week is - Jesus is born, and we celebrate that together, with thanks, music, socialising, prayer and Mass. 

Restoration Work in St Patrick's Church

For the last few months work has been ongoing to try to deal with the problem of dampness and dry rot in an area at the back of St Patrick's Church. There was extensive damage caused by ingress of water over the years, resulting in dampness in the walls and ceilings in a few areas in the church. The main problem has now been dealt with: it involved considerable work both external and internal to prevent the problem arising in the future. A lot of defective timber joists had to be replaced, a new ceiling above the shop had to be put in and a large amount of lead flashing on the roof had to be replaced. There was also some electrical work to be carried out.

In the New Year it is hoped that some further work will take place in two other areas of the church – over the stairs to the organ gallery and over the side door on Our Lady's aisle. I am very happy that the work done to date is of a very high standard and hopefully should go a long way to alleviating the problem. In a building as old as St Patrick's there will always be maintenance to be done and we can never guarantee the building will be totally weather-proofed but this work should greatly help. There will be plastering and painting to be done in the affected areas when they have fully dried out, hopefully next summer.

Thanks to financial help from Wicklow County Council, under their 'heritage grants' scheme, a large part of the cost of the work has been covered. I will update you further when the work is near completion and the final bill comes in.
