In faith and in hope we begin Advent this week with its first candle. With Mary and Joseph we wait for Christ. The candles are lighting the way for them - and for us! The coming light of Jesus lights both our waiting and our journey in life. May it shine the light of Christ into the darknesses of the year since last Christmas - bereavement, illness, depression, disappointments?

We welcome this light in the spirit of Pope Francis:


'Those who have opened their hearts to God's love, heard his voice and re-ceived his light, cannot keep this gift to themselves.

Our annual Christmas Carol Service will be on Sunday 18th December at 4pm in St Patrick's Church.




This has become a very popular part of our Christmas schedule and is a lovely way to lead into the Christmas season.


Our Hospitality Group will be on hand in the De la Salle Pastoral Centre with the mulled wine and mince pies after the service.

WICKLOW HISTORICAL SOCIETY continues its Winter Lecture Series with a talk by Lisa Dolan, Archivist at the Military Archives, on the happenings in Wicklow and its environs during the Civil War period 1921/'23.
