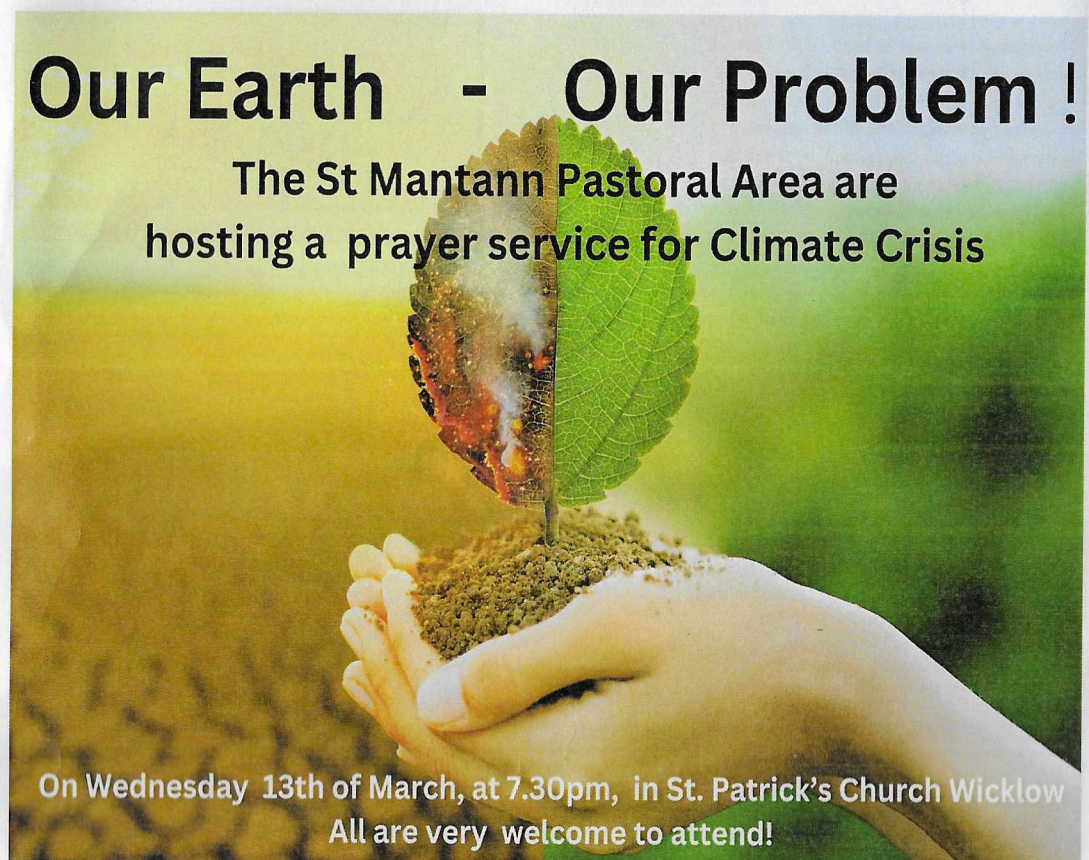
Mother's Day Prayer
