#### Donal Neary S.J. Gospel Reflection ~ The teller of the story

Is this the best story ever written! Because we know it so well, we may gloss over it. It challenges us on many levels - the inclusiveness of everyone as our neighbour bour the way we can pass by human needs, and how the most rejected people can respond positively. It is a story of how many of us miss tragedy under our noses, and how many suffer because of the cruelty of others. It's mainly a story to ask us to respond as positively as we can to all human need.

It also points to the person who told the story. Jesus could tell this story because he was the good Samaritan himself. His heart went out to those who were suffering most at the hands of others. He could tell it also because he knew what it was like to be an outcast - rejected by his own people, and in danger all the time of being victimised even to death like the man at the side of the road.

He brings it farther also - saying that the commandment of God is seen in the way the Good Samaritan responded. The second great commandment is to love the neighbour, and the neighbour is the one of any colour, nationality, age or family who may be in need.


We can ask who are the ones thrown to the side of the road today?



#### **UPDATE ON RECENT NECESSARY MAINTAINANCE.**

In recent months the electrics in Brittas Bay Church have been upgraded at a cost of over €20,000. There is still some plumbing issues to be sorted in relation to hot water. Barndarrig Church will soon have to have a smoke and fire alarm installed as required and it will cost about €28,000. Kilbride and Brittas will also require this. The annual parish insurance of €8,000 has recently been paid.

As the parish runs at a loss each year, we are living off the recent sale of a parish property. That will only keep us going for a few years.
