Donal Neary S.J. Gospel Reflection ~ Faith in action: On fire with hope

This story of Jesus highlights the inequality of rich and poor. Jesus appeals to our sense of justice, right and goodness. There is no need for anyone to come back from the dead to warn us of this inequality. The doors between rich and poor can often be locked as were the doors between Dives and Lazarus. Those outside can only knock, protest and even try to break down the doors. The doors must be opened from the inside.

This message of justice and hope for an equal share of the world's goods for everyone is strong in the gospel of Jesus. His heart was on fire with the hope of a better life for the poor. He went to help them simply because they were poor.

The Christian Church, if it is to be faithful to the gospel, should be involved in many ways in the creation of a more just world. The Christian parish takes a special care of

~ the refugee, the migrant, the war and climate challenged,

~the new poor and ~the old poor,

~the unborn, ~The disabled (Mental/ Physical),

~ the sick, ~the elderly, ~and the dying, in fact all whose voices may not be usually heard.



The parable is meant not to scare with images of punishment, but to make us as aware of the huge inequalities that exist in our world, and in the exploitation of resources in the developing world. Maybe we can pray not to be tormented by any of the pains of this story, but be tormented into action by the hunger, poverty and injustices of our world. Maybe then more doors can be opened from the inside of wealth to the outside of poverty.

Lord, may we build with you a world of justice and peace.

On a bright Tuesday morning 32 pilgrims from the St. Mantan parish area, accompanied by Fr. Aquinas headed off to Lourdes.

Some pilgrims had visited Lourdes before and for some it was their first visit. A group of all ages we travelled in hope, prayer and faith.

Our journey to Lourdes went without a hitch, those more able bodied assisting those who needed a little help. Our hotel La Solitude was, as ever waiting for us. During our stay here we could not fault the food or the service we received.

Fr. Aquinas celebrated 7 masses for us, including in Cite St. Pierre, (City of The Poor), where we received the beautiful sacrament of the sick. We travelled to Bartres, the village where St. Bernadette lived for a time, and attended mass in the Church of John the Baptist, this day was the feast day of St. John the Baptist. Fr. Aquinas assisted the Bishop of Tuam celebrating mass at the grotto, this was a beautiful mass with other pilgrims from Ireland.

We took part in the lower stations of the cross prayerfully led by Fr. Aquinas. Some of our group visited the high stations and some travelled up the Pic de Jour to look down on the city and the sanctuary.

A very special part of visiting Lourdes is the baths. A water gesture is now performed as well as the traditional bath. This water gesture can be undertaken by more than one person, it is a very special, prayerful occasion that shared with a loved one is an emotional, spiritual event.

As a group we processed to the Chapel of Light bringing our pilgrimage candle to take its place among candles from across the globe. Our candle was lit as a beacon

of hope. The intentions of our whole parish, our families and friends were remembered as the candle was lit.

A highlight of our pilgrimage was leading the torchlight procession. Together we followed our beautiful banner as we led the statute of The Virgin Mary to the steps of the basilica. The banner then took pride of place on the basilica steps during the ceremony.

The weather was not very kind to us while we were in Lourdes. Taking part in the procession of the Blessed Sacrament we were underground in the Basilica of Pius X. This does not take away from the solemnity of the occasion but enhanced it.

Fr. Aquinas thank you for accompanying us to Lourdes. Your ceremonies & homolies enhanced our pilgrimage. Your quote "we are supposed to be here now" was so impactful to all.
