Fr Donal Neary, S.J ~ Gospel Reflections for the Year of Matthew

#### Well Done!

Why did he hide the money? Maybe he was asked to be dishonest - to use the money for purposes that diddled others. At the time of this parable most money was made dishonestly. Today this could be like trafficking in drugs or sex, treating our migrant workers badly, paying off violence or buying in a way that diminishes others. The servant was an honest man and suffered for it.

Did you ever feel you were being compromised by being asked to do something that you knew was wrong? A person pressured into watching internet porn, or engaging in sexual activity, or trying out alcohol? They may feel they will suffer in the future if they don't give in.

The godfathers of crime and drugs and violence have a lot to answer for. They are those that make money at the expense of others. This is one way of reading this parable: that people try to get other people to do their dirty work, and they can punish for not doing it.

The man in the end got thrown out by the greedy master but from God he will, 'Well done, come and inherit the kingdom.'

Today we are encouraged by the man who would not do the dirty work for anyone, would not take part in schemes that damaged others, and is the one who really 'did well.'

Can you imagine when you or someone you know went 'against the tide?' Imagine Jesus saying to you, well done.

What might it be for? Lord, may I be faithful to you always Some people will only
"love you" as much as
they can use you.
Their "loyalty" ends
where the benefits stop...





The Citizens Information Board (CIB) has announced an innovative new pilot scheme in Wicklow town.


From 9 November, members of the public can access free, confidential and trusted information and advice online from an Information Officer from South Leinster Citizens Information Service (CIS) in a dedicated private space in Wicklow Library. Members of the public can book an appointment with an expert Information Officer and have a one-on-one online session in a private space in Wicklow Library. The Information Officer will offer expertise and guidance on a range of topics including social welfare, taxation and education.

This new service will be available on Thursday afternoons between 2pm and 4pm by

appointment.

This service is open to any member of the public and an appointment can be made by contacting the CIC in Bray on 0818 07 6780 or email <a href="mailto:bray@citinfo.ie">bray@citinfo.ie</a>. The public can also drop into Wicklow Library to enquire about the service.

CIB is a State agency under the remit of the Department of Social Protection and funds the Citizens Information Services. CIB was awarded funding to run this pilot project in Wicklow and two other libraries though the Public Service Innovation Fund. This project is supported and funded by the Department of Public Expenditure NDP Delivery and Reform.



My Open Library is a service that allows you to access the Wicklow or Arklow Libraries after hours.

Just bring in your library card and we'll sign you up!
