In the smallest of the details of our love and the biggest, God is near. God is near with love and also with care. We might think of it as a powerful care - power not for himself but for us.

God's Power enables us to do what we can't do ourselves, like people in AA who hand their lives over to the higher power each day. Sometimes we find when we are at our lowest God is at his strongest in our lives.

Augustine wrote that 'when we love ourselves least, God loves us most.'

Where do we find him, or rather where does God find us? God is present in all things - we don't have to go to Church or read the bible to find God, as God is present to us in many ways.

WHAT ARE THE MASS COLLECTIONS FOR?

THE FIRST COLLECTION/COMMUN FUND

The First Collection is also known as the Common Fund. This was set up years ago in order that all priests got a fair share of the collection regardless of the size or wealth of the parish that they are working in. It also supports the priests of the Diocese, who are sick and retired. Christmas/Easter & Summer Dues are lodged directly into this fund. This fund has been declining over the past few years which means that priests incomes have also been declining.

THE SECOND COLLECTION/ SHARE

The Share Collection is for the Diocesan building fund which helps to subsidise projects in some very poor parishes. It gives financial assistance to parishes who wouldn't have the necessary income to maintain their buildings. It also funds the central services of the diocese which looks after 199 parishes. The money for this collection is also lodged directly to the Diocese.

THE WEEKLY ENVELOPES & STANDING ORDER / PLANNED GIVING COLLECTION

This collection funds the parish. It pays for the day to day expenses of running the Parish as well as maintaining the Churches, our Parish Centre and the Priests houses. You may contribute to the Parish by weekly envelope, Direct Debit/Standing order or annual donation. If you have thought about contributing to the Parish regularly - please arrange for a box of envelopes or a Direct Debit form to be sent to you by ringing the parish office on 61699.

TAX RELIEF SCHEME

The Tax Relief Scheme for donations to Eligible Charities is of immense benefit to the Parish. It is a very simple but effective way of increasing revenue, whereby the parish can claim back the tax paid on any <u>recorded contributions</u> of €250 or more per annum. Many people have already signed up for this and it has made a big difference to parish income. If you have not already done so, perhaps you would consider signing up for it now. Full details are available on the parish website or from the office.

As the church is registered as a charity, any contribution of $\[mathbb{e}250$ or more (which is $\[mathbb{e}5$ a week), allows the parish to claim back up to 40% of that, which is approx. $\[mathbb{e}100$, where applicable. However, we do have to be able to link the donations to a donor which is where the envelopes/Direct Debit/Standing Orders becomes important. The only information that is required from the contributor is - name, address, PPS number and a signature. Please be assured that any information received will be treated with the of confidence and that there is $\[mathbb{N}0\]$ involvement at all from any tax officials. If you pay income tax and if you have contributed $\[mathbb{e}250\]$ or more to the $\[mathbb{Dues}$ and $\[mathbb{Family}$ Offering, the Parish can claim back the tax on your donation at no cost whatsoever to the contributor. Please be assured that the parish staff do not have any access to any personal details of any parishioner signing up to this scheme. It is totally confidential.

Please note that cash placed in the collection baskets does not qualify for Tax Relief as it cannot be traced back to a donor and is therefore added to the Diocesan 1st & 2nd collections.

A sincere and genuine thanks to all parishioners who continuously support the parish through their contributions and to those who have signed up to the CHY3 scheme and we look forward to your continued support in the future.

Neda's Story.....

Imagine being away from your family for more than three years just for a better future. It's not just that; on the other side of the world your family is living a different life. your sisters can't go to school just because they are women. They can't go outside the house without a man, just because they were born female. Or going out with fear just because you are an ethnic minority and treated differently. The father lost his job because of the country's situation. And all this is not enough, there is also the water crises, Women are not allowed to use the public bath houses. And the father can't afford to provide all this for the family.

This is the life story of a young Afghan lady staying with me since 2021. She cannot meet her family because of the situation in Afghanistan, and they cannot go to a second country because of poverty, and she is not just trying to build her future but see every day how her sisters' futures are falling apart, and she can't do anything about it. But today we have a chance to help them. We can be a means of good for this family and bring them together. All they want is a peaceful life where the women of the family can go out of the house like normal people. By joining our community sponsorship group, we can bring the family together and give them a new life. We are all humans and we all have feelings, you might feel it even if you didn't experience it. And I hope no one separates' from their family for any reason.

Support Our Community Sponsorship Effort

Since February 2022, a young Afghan student has been living with me in Wicklow Town, integrating well into Irish society through school and college. This year, the Irish Government's IRPP will issue 50 visas under the Humanitarian Admissions Programme (HAP25), administered by the Open Community. We've formed a Community Sponsorship Group to help bring this family to Ireland but we need community support to make this happen.


